The secret to successful gardening is putting the right plant in the right place. The following tables will help you choose the best native plants for the different sites in your garden. When buying plants, first consider whether they will be in mostly sunny or shady areas. Partial shade means that there should be at least a few

hours of direct sunshine sometime during the day. Then consider the soil conditions. Although many of the plants listed here grow in dry or moist sites, some have particular cultural requirements. For example, some plants need soils that are well-drained, which means the roots cannot be sitting in water for an extended period of time. In other circumstances, only consider drought tolerant plants for very dry areas in your garden. These critical success factors are found in the table under Soil Conditions.

Everyone can enhance the enjoyment of their garden by incorporating plants that provide food and shelter for wildlife. Native plants are particularly valuable because they help indigenous wildlife populations survive. Plant cover is important for providing an


undisturbed area where wildlife can escape from danger, find shelter from weather and raise their young. Providing clean, fresh water for wildlife is also important for year round drinking and bathing. The table has information on the wildlife values of particular native plants. The chances of seeing particular species, such as hummingbirds, in your yard increases when you provide the appropriate habitat. Consider planting favourite food sources listed in the table.
