

Quick Reference to Saanich Poultry Regulations

Backyard hens are allowed on single family parcels with an area:

Greater than 4,000 m² (0.4 ha) or 43,056 ft² (1 acre) - No limit

Setbacks - 42.6m (140ft) from a road & 45.7m (150ft) from property lines.

Greater than 1,858m² (0.18 ha) or 20,000 ft² (0.45 acre) – up to 30 chickens

• Setbacks - 15.2m (49ft) from a road & 7.6m (25ft) from any other property line;

Greater than 1,114.8m² (0.11 ha) or 12,000 ft² (0.27 acre)- up to 10 chickens

• Setbacks - 7.6m (25ft) from a road & 4.57m (15m) any other property line;

Greater than 557 m² (0.05ha) or 6,000 ft² (0.13acre) within a single family residential zone – up to 5 hens

- · No roosters allowed
- Located in rear yard only
- Setbacks 3m (9ft 9in)from side & rear lot line
- Setback 3m (9ft 9in) from windows or doors
- 0.37 m² (4ft²) of indoor coop
- 0.92m² (10ft²) of roofed outdoor enclosure per hen
- Coop not to exceed 9.2m² (100ft²) area
- Max. 2m (6ft 6in) in height
- Registration required
- Owner of the hens needs to reside on the parcel where the hens are kept




Figure 1: Typical residential lot 560 m2.

Definitions include:

Poultry means any bird normally raised for food or egg production.

Hen means a domesticated female chicken.
