#### **VOLUNTEER PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS**

The Coordinator of Volunteer Services presented the Committee with an update of Saanich Volunteer Services, and the following was noted:

- Saanich has a long history of strong volunteerism. Over 150 volunteers contributed 5420 volunteer hours last year.
- Volunteers are often referred by word of mouth.
- Improvements to Saanich's Volunteer recognition could be considered.
- Complimentary recreation and ceramic studio time are given as recognition of volunteer efforts.
- A spotlight on volunteering could be placed on Saanich's Facebook page and perhaps an articles highlighting Saanich volunteers in the Saanich Newspaper.

## "I BELONG HERE" PROPOSED TAG LINE FOR PARKS AND RECREATION

The Marketing Specialist provide the Committee with information on the Parks and Recreation department's proposed tag line "I Belong Here", the following was noted:

- Saanich's recreation catchment extends beyond Saanich's geographical boundaries.
- The Tag line tested well with focus groups.
- The tag line supports the vision of the Parks and Recreation department.
- The tag line offers good flexibility for Saanich marketing needs.

## **MOUNT DOUGLAS PARK ACCESS STUDY**

The Parks Planner discussed the Mount Douglas Park Access Study, the following was noted:

- A report will go to Council in November 2016, outing the results of the study.
- Areas of interest for the study include:

- Current access points
- Current parking to access the park
- Identification of the levels of trail difficulty
- Currently parking data is largely anecdotal, a proper parking study will be undertaken as part of the Mount Douglas Park Access Study.
- A consultant has been hired to assist with the Mount Douglas Park Access Study.
- Members of PTR and other key stakeholders will be approached to participate with the study.

#### **TOLMIE PARK IMPROVEMENTS:**

The Parks Planner updated the Committee on proposed improvements for Tolmie Park and the following was noted:

- The proposed plans are available on the Saanich website.
- Dog walking near the playground is a concern.
- Residents are concerned with possible parking and increased traffic if dedicated pickleball courts are put into the park.
- Lighting and water fountains are two issues that will be considered.
- There are some drainage issues within the park that will be addressed within the scope of the park improvements.

### **CADBORO-GYRO INTERPRETIVE SIGNS**

The Senior Manager of Parks, provided the Committee with draft of the signage that will be placed within Cadboro-Gyro Park. The two signs consist of a First Nations sign and a Post Contact sign.
