





Process Background

Report back to Council:

- Evaluation of 2008 OCP
- Assess opportunity to link OCP with One Planet Saanich and/or Doughnut Economics frameworks
- Terms of Reference for Strategic OCP Update





Evaluation Findings

Substantial progress completed

Strengths:

- 3-pillar sustainability foundation
- Directs growth into centres/villages, complete communities
- Linked with Strategic Plan, strong organizational uptake
- Closely aligned with RGS, integrates regional collaboration



Evaluation Findings

Opportunities:

- Incorporate initiatives working towards FN reconciliation
- Strengthen overall framework for centre, village and designated corridor planning
- Clarify natural environment objectives (Resilient Saanich)
- Expand direction on infill policy/"missing middle" program
- Update language/maps/data

Sustainability Frameworks

Current model provides strong foundation

Important to retain integrity of existing vision/values

Four priority opportunity areas:

- Link 3-pillar approach to One Planet Living
- Expand evaluation and monitoring component, including adding the ecological footprint as a 5-yr indicator
- Review Social Well-being section to modernize language, incorporate best practices, and identify future work
- Reinforce existing OCP direction to develop complete communities based on walkable neighbourhoods, transit, and low carbon/active transportation







Why a "Strategic" Update

- Majority of plan content still relevant
- Build on recent processes and adopted policy/Council direction
- Effective use of limited resources
- Make priority updates in a short time frame





Project Scope

- Update OCP to incorporate recent Council work and District-wide processes
- Integrate new demographic data/relevant statistics
- Refine sustainability framework
- Strengthen monitoring/implementation



Project Scope – Land Use

- Add "Corridor" policies
- Expand on "missing middle" housing/infill policies
- Update guidance on parks for complete communities
- Further enhance walkable neighbourhoods
- Provide more clarity on maps


