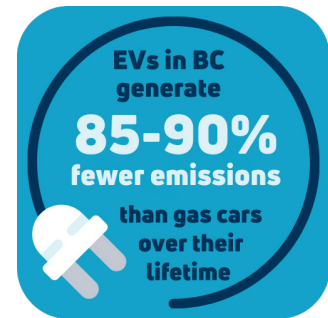


# EV charging stations are popping up everywhere

There is a robust and growing network of EV charging stations in the Capital Region and throughout BC

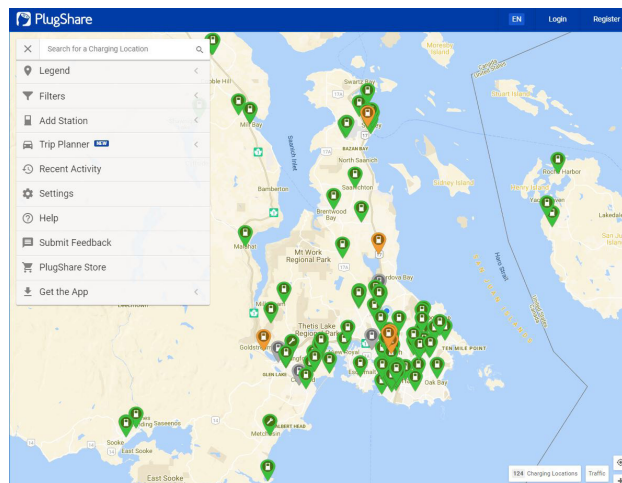

## The Capital Region public charging network

Electric vehicle charging stations are popping up all over BC - including rural areas. The Capital Region has the highest rates of EV ownership in the country and we have the public charging network to go along with it. With an ever-expanding charging network across BC and right here in the Capital Region, there is no need for range anxiety.

Municipalities throughout the Capital Region are working to install more public EV charging stations where people need them most, and businesses are increasingly making them available for their customers and employees as well. Whether you need a quick top-up charge or you don't have access to charging at home, you can likely [find somewhere to plug in](#) at the mall or grocery store, at the library, or while you're working out. Throughout the CRD, there are currently 210 Level 2 and 29 DC Fast Charging (Level 3) stations available to the public with more coming online all the time!



## Road tripping

There are nearly 2,000 Level 2 and 375 DC Fast Charging stations available to the public throughout BC, with more coming online all of the time! Public EV charging stations are easy to find using apps such as [PlugShare](#) and [ChargeHub](#). Using such apps, EV owners can add, review, and edit charging station information and even safely share their private home charging station with other drivers.

According to Natural Resources Canada, there are nearly 11,000 Level 2 EV chargers and over 2,200 DC Fast Chargers publically available across Canada, making EV road trips a breeze.
