Council has approved Saanich's 2018 budget in accordance with the 2015-2018 Strategic Plan and their budget guidelines.


Council's decisions continue to maintain the service levels for the broad range of services provided by Saanich. The budget decisions improve the ability to manage and maintain assets such as roads, underground systems, buildings and trails as well as the vehicles, machinery and equipment that support their repair and maintenance. The budget also supports the systems that enable provision of secure services in the information age.

The Strategic Plan themes are all represented in the budget with numerous projects, including:

- Safe community Safe Routes to School program.
- Healthy community Park, playground and trail infrastructure projects to support active living.
- Sustainable environment Replacement program for essential water and sewer systems.
- Balanced transportation Improvements to sidewalks, bikeways, bus stops, signals and lighting.

How are your taxes calculated? Assessed value/1000 x tax rate = tax owing

Home owner grants:

- Claim your home owner grant online at saanich.ca/grant – do not claim your grant at your financial institution.
- You will need your folio number and your access code from your tax notice to claim online.
- You must submit a grant application each year you are eligible and it must be submitted by July 3, 2018 to avoid penalty.
- Unclaimed grants constitute unpaid taxes and will be subject to a 10% penalty if not claimed by July 3, 2018.

Property tax payments:

- Please ensure when paying online that you check your financial institution's local cut-off time to ensure payment is received by the due date.
- Any payments with a payment date after July 3, 2018 will be considered late and will be subject to a 10% penalty.

Tuesday, July 3, 2018

Online services are described below, or go to **saanich.ca/tax** for a list of ways to pay.

Deferment application or renewals:

- All deferment applications and renewals must be received at the District of Saanich by July 3, 2018.
 Applications and renewals received after July 3, 2018 are subject to a 10% penalty.
- You must submit a renewal application every year you intend to defer your property taxes.
- Applications that are not approved by the Provincial Deferment Office will be subject to a 10% penalty.

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How your assessment affects your taxes

The average increase for residential property assessments is 16% for 2018. The average tax increase is 3.07% or \$77 per household.
