The Municipality of Saanich is a beautiful place to live for many reasons, not the least of which is our spectacular natural environment. Preservation of our natural heritage in Saanich is an important goal shared by both the Municipality and the community.

The Native Plant Salvage Program helps to:

- Protect genetic, species and ecosystem **M** diversity in our region
- Restore habitat for wildlife 2
- Encourage the use of native plants in **Q** gardens and community projects
- **R** Promote the preservation and restoration of environmentally significant areas in Saanich

Salvaging native plants is not an alternative to habitat protection, nor is it considered mitigation. The salvage program is a stewardship initiative that compliments other environmental protection tools.

The Native Plant Salvage Program is coordinated by Saanich Environmental Services in the Planning Department. Salvaging takes place on sites where access has been granted by landowners/developers, and where native plants would otherwise be lost to development acitivities. All salvage sites have development approvals in place and assessments have been conducted for habitat and species protection.

Membership is required to salvage on sites registered in this program. Environmental Services works with members to ensure safety and appropriate salvaging practices.

- All members sign a waiver / release of C3 liability form
- Only members salvage at the sites œ
- Members follow program policies & **CR** site guidelines
- Rescued plants are not for sale œ
- Salvaged plants are used to restore **Q** private lands and in community restoration projects
