**CHAIRS REMARKS**

The Chair will be using the brainstorming document to guide the agenda for future meetings.

**PRESENTATION – JAKE ENNS**

Jake Enns presented on ways to engage the public to reduce mental health issues and foster connections, the following was noted:

- To be human is to be amazing, we can enjoy the world with all senses. Engagement is more than a word, every viewpoint is essential for longevity and impact in what we do.
- Humans need to find common ground to overcome issues together. Many people are not equipped with communication skills to talk about what is important to them.
- The goal is to bring everyone together for meaningful connections in a collaborative way.
- If Saanich was to create a community dome for people to learn in, communicate, and foster a deeper connection, it would be beneficial to the community. The dome could be a hands on learning centre where residents could come together to heal from the ongoing mental health effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.

**UPDATE ON OVERDOSE CRISIS**

The Chair verbally updated the committee on actions taken to address the overdose crisis, the following was noted:

- Councillor Ned Taylor and Councillor Karen Harper wrote a report on Actions to Address the Overdose Crisis, which recently went to Council. Council voted unanimously in favour of the recommendations on February 1, 2021.
- Actions are being taken to increase advocacy with senior levels of government.

- It is important to encourage other municipal governments and stakeholders to advocate for solutions to the overdose crisis with senior levels of government as well.
- The report will be sent to all other municipal councils in British Columbia.
- The committee would like to receive updates on the actions being taken to address the overdose crisis on a regular basis.

**SAANICH STRATEGIC PLAN**

The Chair provided a brief overview of the goals of the Saanich Strategic Plan, which guide the initiatives and actions that are detailed in the plan. The following was noted:

- The Strategic Plan has been approved by Council. There is the opportunity for the committee to recommend that Council add items to the strategic plan.
