#### SAANICH HERITAGE FOUNDATION UPDATE

Sonia Nicholson presented an update on the Saanich Heritage Foundation and stated:

- The Saanich Heritage Foundation meeting schedule was impacted due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, meetings have resumed via electronic/virtual participation.
- Recent outreach efforts include the creation of social media accounts and a new logo.
- Outreach aims to inform residents about grants and funding that are available as well as to encourage new Heritage designations.

#### **PUBLIC ART UPDATES**

Megan Squires, Community Planner provided an update on current Saanich public art initiatives:

- The redevelopment process for Saanich Fire Hall #2 in Royal Oak is currently underway. As per the Saanich Comprehensive Arts Policy, the project will meet Civic Public Art Program requirements, which includes a jury process for selecting the proposed artwork.
- The jury process will likely be initiated in 2021, with the redevelopment project being anticipated to be completed in 2022.
- The Arts Culture and Heritage Committee (ACH) will receive a presentation on the redevelopment project from Stacy McGhee, Program Manager, Strategic Facilities Planning, at a future ACH meeting.

#### **ARTS PROGRAMMING & COMMUNITY ARTS INITIATIVES**

Brenda Weatherston, Community Arts Specialist provided information on community arts initiatives. The following was noted:

- The COVID-19 pandemic led to cancellation of multiple community arts initiatives.
- HeArts Together is an initiative undertaken with community partners, which recognized the need to support members of the community who may be isolated and organizations adversely impacted by shut downs related to the pandemic.
- Members of community who took part in the HeArts Together Program (Website: <a href="https://www.saanich.ca/EN/main/parks-recreation-community/arts/hearts-together-community-art-project.html">https://www.saanich.ca/EN/main/parks-recreation-community/arts/hearts-together-community-art-project.html</a>) decorated wood and clay heart cut-outs, which were created and donated by community partners. The decorated hearts were then displayed at various locations through the community. Approximately 150 hearts had been completed to date.
- Moon Festival displays have been put up at Gordon Head Rec Centre, as well as a Flow Thru lantern and light display, which can be viewed on foot, by bicycle or car.
- There were a number of small pop up style Music in the Community and Arts in the Community engagements in the parks.

Members of the committee were grateful for the music and art displays that have taken place in the community despite the current challenges.

#### **COMMITTEE ROUNDTABLE**

The committee discussed possible initiatives that could be taken on in light of the current pandemic and restrictions on large gatherings. The following was noted:

- Most community events Saanich events have been put on hold.
- It was noted that Saanich does not have a formal Arts Council. Members of the committee are interested in promoting the arts and music that already exist within Saanich. Some municipalities have an Arts Council, including Victoria and Esquimalt.
- Some members of the committee are interested in obtaining more information regarding the possible role of a Saanich Arts Council or additional support for existing arts groups.
- An informal working group was formed by J. Ellis, M. Sealy and D. Beaton to explore the idea of forming a Saanich Arts Council, and what the role of the committee would be.

#### **Archives Reopening**

After receiving approval for our COVID-19 safety plan, and in co-operation with the GVPL, the Archives has reopened on a limited basis. We are currently open to one visitor at a time, by appointment only, on weekdays between 11:00 am and 2:00 pm. We continue to welcome inquiries by phone and email.

Since reopening, Archives staff have been busy getting in touch with all the people on our contact list who expressed an interest in visiting the Archives to donate items or to do research during our 14 month closure.

#### **Recent Archives Activities**

#### Online resources added

We've continued to expand our online presence in order to provide more historical information about Saanich and to connect with the community.

We've recently added over 30 oral history transcripts to our Collections & Research web page. These transcripts are full of interesting information and stories told by the people who experienced local history first-hand. Some examples of recently added names are: Ed Lum, former Mayor of Saanich; Ursula Jupp, local historian and Gordon Head resident; Eric McMorran, of the McMorran Resort in Cordova Bay.

## **HeArts Together Community Art Project:**

The <u>HeArts Together Community Arts Project</u> continues to create and spread messages of hope and caring throughout Saanich during the pandemic. Over 600 wood and clay hearts have been created with community partners to date, with new collaborations begun with Luther Court Complex Care and Assisted Care Facility, the Boy Scouts, and Island Community Mental Health Association. A new installation of hearts has popped up at Rudd Park, with more planned for good weather spells this fall.

# **Arts Programs and Community-Partnered Programs:**

Arts programs were back this fall at Saanich facilities as well as community arts partnership programs with groups at Cedar Hill. Community partners such as the Salvation Army and the Victoria Women's Transition House are grateful to be collaborating once again on art and writing/spoken word programs that provide wellness benefits to participants. As well, a tour and hands-on opportunity was recently organized for a small group with the Island Community Mental Health Association. Recent changes to health orders are pausing some movement-based arts programs (e.g. dance) for the near future.

### **Arts in Community Pop-ups:**

Late fall arts in community performances have been put on hold with changes to PHO safety requirements. The arts, music and performance community pop-up program has been very successful and is being planned to continue in 2021.

#### **Cedar Hill Recreation and Arts Centre Exhibits:**

Continuation of exhibitions at Cedar Hill has been approved and new guidelines and procedures that meet COVID safety requirements and facility operational needs are being finalized. Exhibitions are expected to resume in 2021.

# Family Arts Festival, February 2021

With present restrictions on events and public gathering, modified plans for Family Arts Festival are being explored. To celebrate both arts and creativity as well as the Family Day holiday on February 15, staff are considering creative options for online delivery of some limited arts activities and performances as well as distributed "at-home" activities or small family "bubble" activities at the Centre. Plans will be shared as options evolve in 2021.
