MINUTES

GOVERNANCE REVIEW

The Chair updated the Committee with a request from the Governance Review Committee for two members of ENA to meet with the Governance Review Committee to discuss the role of ENA.

UPTOWN DOUGLAS CORRIDOR UPDATE

The Senior Planner updated the Committee on the proposed Uptown Douglas Corridor Plan. The following highlights are noted:

- The overall vision for the Uptown Douglas Corridor Plan is to create spaces for people, the heart of Saanich.
- Design workshop to discuss land use provided information to help develop a draft of strategies for the Uptown Douglas Corridor.
- The information from the design workshop has been integrated into themes/layers:
 - Green layer: Parks, open space, natural environment, green building, cultural/recreational connections and sustainability.
 - Mobility layer: recognizes the need for all transportation modalities.
 - Land-use layer: building form and character, economic vibrancy and place making.
- A "new idea" was raised regarding turning Blanchard Street back into a two way road and updating Vernon Avenue into a neighbourhood street. This proposed adjustment in the roadways would result in improvements for active transportation modes.

Committee discussion occurred and the following highlights are noted:

- Transportation impacts and studies need to be carefully considered in this main transportation corridor to ensure that the proposed redevelopment is appropriate.

- Consideration for mixed use residential housing to allow for families to live within the proposed update area, should be explored.
- Future opportunities for Cecelia Creek daylighting should be explored in the Uptown Douglas Corridor Plan.
- Extensive efforts have been made to engage stakeholders to participate in the public engagement sessions.
- Consideration of the development communities needs when requesting the addition of significant amounts of green space, parks and creek daylighting need to be addressed. Will Saanich be prepared to allow development opportunities to free up land for the gray to green transition?
- The City of Victoria is also exploring the updating of the neighbouring Burnside Gorge area.

that the EDPA guidelines of the Official Community Plan be kept in place while amendments are being considered by Council.”

CONSERVATION TAX CREDIT

The Manager of Environmental Services facilitated a continuing discussion on a Conservation Tax Credit. The Manager of Environmental Services discussed the correspondence with A. Birch, Land Trust Alliance of British Columbia, Volunteer addressing question the ENA Committee put forward. Accordingly the Committee resolved as follows:
