PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to provide the Committee with an overview of Community Services division activities.

DISCUSSION

Older Adult Services: Older Adults is now actively working with new and returning Saanich Volunteers who applied for our Community Ambassador Welcome Desk Program. We know that there is a variety of ways to be welcoming, and we look forward to developing this program with the community and volunteers over time. We will be soft starting by offering added welcoming services over the summer, from the hub of the desks located in the main lobbies. We intend to grow the program slowly over time with the focus on quality over quantity, and with the engagement of community feedback, centre goals

and volunteer skills as key in the development of the offerings. Volunteers will initially be trained to be able to give site tours of our facilities to newcomers or interested members of the public. These tours will include the accessibility features and the external surrounding parking and transportation of the site. The volunteers will also be able to share community information on upcoming events, celebrations, projects and programs. They will help people navigate the online world of Saanich as another core skill, in addition to being a welcome smile or a helping hand near the entrance of our centres. Each Volunteer will eventually specialize in a welcome feature that they can offer such as helping host lobby social times for Older Adults for example or facilitating a monthly Safety Series where Saanich Police Inspectors help build public safety skills and share timely information.

Financial Assistance: Financial assistance can look many ways. Here is a little celebration of the past, present and future!

The pandemic paused many things....but KidsFUNd kept things going to support children living in a family home on a low income. This fund has suffered greatly has we were unable to rely on the main annual "KidsFUNd" Celebration day to keep the fund plush. However, on July 10th in coordination with Strawberry Festival, we will be back! A huge thank you to our partners the Saanich Fire Charitable Foundation and Thrifty Foods for their ongoing support.

Child and Youth Services: For five years now, Youth services has partnered with Sheepdog self-protection to offer courses and workshops to young women and teens on how to fight back to protect themselves. They had a blast together and finished up with a pizza party to talk about their learning evening.
