
#### REASON

## Older facilities needing attention

For several of our older (+40 years) facilities, we see the need to be pro-active in the coming years to address the issues of building capacity, condition and risk. And while our more recent facilities (5 to 30 years of age) appear to be satisfactory now, we know in another 20 years, they will require more attention.

#### What this means to you.

We have a plan that will incrementally improve, remediate and redevelop our facilities as required.

# Parks and Public Works Yard is #1 priority

After recent facility condition assessments and service delivery analysis, the needs and priorities determined include:

- Our primary facility renewal is through maintenance and repair.
- Our facility prioritization of capital investment can be grouped into the following three ranked categories of descending urgency:
