RECOMMENDATION

That Council write to the Office of the Prime Minster, the Minister of Finance, and the Minister of Families, Children, and Social Development, requesting that the Federal Government take clear action to step forward with concrete funding support to match the funding already committed by the Provincial Government of British Columbia for supported housing, given the crisis in available supported housing in our region and Province.

BACKGROUND:

Collectively across Canada we recognize the demands that COVID-19 has placed upon our residents, our health, and our economy. Amidst this significant crisis of blended issues we applaud the practical, well-measured steps the Federal Government has taken to protect our residents' health and to soften the economic impacts.

We also recognize the great value that is realized across Canada when our three levels of government, Federal, Provincial, and Municipal, work jointly together to address the pressing issues of the day. The exceptional, cooperative approach of our governments in addressing COVID-19 has provided an example of this.

An additional area that all Federal and all governments have spoken up on is the collective, collaborative work needed to address the needs for the adequate provision of supported housing.

In British Columbia, the Provincial Government and Municipalities are stepping up with funding and the resources to join with the Federal Government. By example, our Provincial Government has put forward funding and municipalities are aiding and identifying suitable lands.



To date, the financial commitment and action by the Federal Government has yet to be clarified and acted upon. This is causing great difficulties in moving forward. We request that the Federal government steps forward with a clear contribution matching that of the Provincial government.
