New Photos in Parks Department Collection!

Over the past few months, Saanich Archives staff have been working through some new additions to our holdings and making more visual records available online. One of the larger collections recently added to our online catalogue is photos from the Saanich Parks Department from the late 1950s through the late 1960s. While the vast majority of the photos are fairly simple landscape photos



of Saanich's various parks, the items accessible online are a more curated collection highlighting the whimsy inherent in parks - featuring children (and adults!) at play. This online selection of photos also features some beautiful colour photos of Saanich Municipal Hall and gardens, an aerial photo of Beaver Lake, the Gorge beautification, and even some municipal workers having a snowball fight in the aftermath of the 1969 blizzard! Evenings in the Archives!



Archives mystery - envelopes of shapes found in Goward files

As we continue to work through some parts of our holdings that need to be reorganized or processed more fully, we occasionally find ourselves puzzled by items that have been included in a fonds. We are including one of these mysteries in the newsletter, in hopes that perhaps one of you lovely people can shed some light on what this might be! Found in amongst some correspondence of a prominent Saanich family, there were two envelopes filled with these shapes cut from construction paper - one of the envelopes also contained the business card of a professor from Uvic.
