


George Jay School girl's field hockey team, 1912 (2007-196-050)

Field hockey was one of the first sports that girls and young women could play with few of the usual restrictions placed upon them. Its widespread adoption beginning in the 1860s led to further acceptance of girls in other organized sports such as baseball, golf, equestrian, and rowing.

Her late husband, Richard Layritz, had donated the land for the ballpark to Saanich with the stipulation that it be fenced and used as a park for children.








Men's race at Victoria Amateur Swim Club gala on the Gorge, 1922 (2012-034-005)
