

# Cedar Hill Golf Course

## Re-opening Safety Protocols for Golfers

### General Information

- Please stay home if you are sick. If you have any symptoms, please call 8-1-1 or use the BCCDC Self-Assessment tool: <https://bc.thrive.health/covid19/> prior to entering the Cedar Hill Golf Course.
- Stay home if you have travelled outside of Canada. You are required to self-isolate for a period of 14 days. If you experienced symptoms, you are required to self-isolate for 10 days after onset of symptoms.
- Practice good coughing and sneezing etiquette: cover your mouth and nose when you cough or sneeze. Cough or sneeze into a tissue or into your arm/elbow and then wash your hands.
- Book ahead for a tee time by going online to [saanich.ca/golf](http://saanich.ca/golf) or by calling 250-475-7151. No walk on traffic at this time. Groups will play as booked in the tee time and there is no joining other players.
  - Tee time intervals are spread out to increase the physical distance between players.
- Show your pass or pay at the service window with credit card or debit card. No cash payments.
- There are no clubhouse or food services available at this time. You may bring your own beverage in a sealed container, however, alcoholic beverages are prohibited. Golfers with alcohol will have their game stopped.
- Physical distancing is not optional. Those who are unable to follow physical distancing guidelines will have their game stopped. Golfers must stay 6 feet or 2 meters apart.

### Getting Ready to Play/Welcome Back

- Please plan to arrive at the pro-shop no more than 10 minutes before your tee time. All warm-up areas, such as the putting green, chipping area and driving range, are closed.
- Exterior clubhouse washrooms are open 8 am until dusk. Please follow all personal hygiene protocols and wash your hands with soap and water before commencing play.
- Maintaining physical distancing means remaining a minimum of 2 meters (6 feet or 4 golf clubs) apart from your golf pals. Proper physical distancing eliminates fist-bumps or handshakes. Give a hat tip a try for this round.
- Proceed directly to the pro-shop to check-in. The inside of the pro-shop is closed to the public, but service windows are open. Observe the signs at the service windows indicating where to approach for pass holders and alternately for credit or debit payments.



## During Play

- Your gear is your own. No sharing of balls, tees, ball markers, clubs, snacks, sunscreen or beverages. This includes picking up items for others.
- High touch items are unavailable. This includes: scorecards, pencils, ball washers, tee holders, shoe cleaner, bunker rakes, benches and sand dispensers.
- Bring your own pencil or pen.
- One person at the tee box at a time.
- Smooth bunker sand with feet or club.
- All garbage cans are removed. Please hold on to your garbage and pack it out with you. This includes gloves and masks if you elect to wear them.
- Power carts are single rider, unless occupied by two people from the same household.
- Pull carts are available and cleaned after each use.
- Do not touch the flag stick, leave the flag/pin in the hole. The cup is upside down and your ball will tap the cup instead of dropping inside.
- Take note of the signs around the golf course with tips and reminders about play.
- No playing through.
- If balls land close together on the golf course, please designate one person to clear their ball first. You may need to adjust your normal pattern of play to ensure physical distancing.

## After the Round

- Once you finish your game, please head directly to your vehicle. Continue to maintain the physical distance of 6 feet (2 meters) from others in the parking lot and then depart from the premises.

## Cleaning Protocols

- All Proshop high touch surfaces are regularly sanitized by Proshop clerks.
  - This includes any surfaces at ticket counter (i.e. debit machine).
- High touch areas throughout the course have been removed, or are taped off.
- Washrooms are cleaned every 4 hours.
- Employees follow all personal hygiene requirements including regular hand washing and staying home if they feel sick.
- Employees will wear protective gloves when handling hole cups and flags, and wash their hands after removing gloves.
