



Rose Prevost currently lives in British Columbia. She was born in Winnipeg Manitoba. Rose is a Metis Woman who self identifies as a Canadian Indigenous person. She remembers as a child watching women make things and then recreating the items without lessons or instructions. In her culture this natural ability to know how to create Indigenous artwork is referred to as being a Kaykway aen Ooshihtaat which means a maker of things. Rose went to Thompson Rivers University where she earned

a Bachelor of Fine Arts. Her focus in University was alternative analogue photography, printmaking and traditional art forms that focuses on topics that have a cultural significance to her and her heritage. Rose is also experienced in worked in textile art, fiber art, soap stone and pipestone carving, leather work, beading and painting.
