Normandy Park Playground Replacement Project

Survey Results Summary

Online survey open from January 5, 2021 – February 8, 2021


- 62 responses received
- 40% of respondents live within elsewhere in Saanich, followed by 39% who live within a 5 minute walk of Normandy Park
- 92% of respondents use the playground while 43% of respondents use the park for walking, followed by 26% of respondents who use the park for leisure recreation
- 29% of respondents use the playground several times a week, followed by 23% of respondents who use the playground once a month
- 63% of respondents walk to the park
- Most popular activities on the current playground include climbing (66%), sliding (59%), and rocking on teeter totter (38%)
- Top 5 most valued play features were:
 - Climbing features (87%)
 - Swings (70%)
 - Playhouse (38%)
 - Natural play (37%)
 - Spinning features (33%)
- 62% of respondents said a sand area is not important
- Open-ended responses for other ideas or comments to improve the playground at Normandy Park:
 - Equipment for older kids (7 respondents)
 - Wood chips surfacing, no sand (7 respondents)
 - Zipline (6 respondents)
 - Swings (4 respondents)
 - Benches and tables (3 respondents)
 - Natural/adventure play (3 respondents)

A wide variety of comments were received for additional improvements to Normandy Park playground. Given the project constraints of budget, timing and project scope, we have identified the following priorities:

- Fun & challenging climbing features
- Swings are important!
- Natural play elements




Q1 How close do you live to Normandy Park?


Q2 What kinds of activities do you use the park for? Please check all that apply.


Q3 How often do you and your family use the playground?


Q4 How do you typically get to the park?



Q6 What play features does your child value most? (Choose top 3)


