About the Park:

In 1953, Richard Layritz donated 15.5 acres (6.27Ha) to Saanich with the stipulation that they be fenced in and used as a park for children. A plaque commemorating this donation is located on a rock near the parking lot. Today, this large community park is home to Layritz Little League, the Prospect Lake Soccer Club and the Layritz Intermediate Baseball Association.





Dogs may be off leash but under control at all times.

Dogs are not permitted on the artificial turf field or playground and must be leashed within 10m of the playground.

Dogs are not allowed in fenced baseball fields from March 1 to October 31.









Accessed primarily from Layritz PI (with a limit of 2 hours parking business days), the park is also accessible from Markham Rd in the <u>Vancouver Island Technology Park (VITP)</u>. This is a private pay parking lot that Layritz Park users can park for free Monday to Friday 5:30 to 10 p.m. and Saturday, Sunday and holidays 7 a.m. to 10 p.m.

With seven ball diamonds (T-ball, softball and baseball), one artificial turf soccer field, walking trails, picnic area and a playground, there is lots to do in the park! Want to reserve a space in the park? Submit a <u>park permit</u> request application.

The large playground includes a climbing net, bouldering rocks, swings and a separate structure for the younger 2 to 5 year old children.

The parking lot has more than 100 parking stalls, including dedicated accessible parking spots and a drop off/pick up zone. Find public washrooms in the lower level of the building near the artificial turf soccer field.


The park also currently offers a disc golf course! This 9-hole course starts near the VITP side of the park and weaves through an open field full of small trees and shrubs.
