
Q1 How close do you live to Beckwith Park?




Q2 How often do you visit the park?

Q3 Did you attend the public open house and presentation on February 7, 2023?







Eutrophication has been accelerated in the ponds due to runoff from the Peninsula Bulldozing site. Chicken manure was used in topsoil mixing and during rains, runoff from the resulting massive piles of rich soil drained into the ponds. Runoff from soil piles into the ponds during heavy rain is still occurring and this must stop immediately. Due to the eutrophication in the ponds, some mitigation needs to be undertaken which may include reduction in the number of Water Lillie and management of algae. Responsibility for the water license and any remediation for eutrophication of the ponds belongs to the willing purchaser of the properties and water licenses. It is a core principle that private companies should take full responsibility for all liabilities they willingly accept. Monies from Saanich Municipality should not be required for any remediation of any issues resulting from the partial decommissioning of the ponds.

In conjunction with any work that is done on the dam (not at some distant, unspecified point in time) I would like Saanich Parks to develop and implement an effective plan to deal with all of the blackberry growth around the pond and in the park land running downhill from the pond to the Blenkinsop Valley. The blackberries in the NE corner are the least of the problem and tackling them appears to be primarily about removing a threat to Don Mann's adjacent property to make it more attractive for development. I also don't believe that burying blackberries will be effective in the long term, as the plants on the edges of the berm will quickly creep out and recolonize the surrounding area and the berm itself. And I have concerns about what kind of soil will be used for the berm; it absolutely must be free of any contaminants that could leach into the pond and downstream waterways. Finally, the eradication of blackberries and other nonnative invasive species in and around the pond should not be left to community volunteers. As dedicated as they are, it's too big a job for them to do on their own. 
