WHERE THE PREMISES IS USED AS: Open Space Encampment

Having inspected the premises of the above address on the 27th Day of June, 2018.

I find that Observations were made under Section 21 of the Fire Services Act:

- (a) The premises are in a state of disrepair that a fire starting in them might spread rapidly to endanger life or other property;
 - 1. It was observed during an inspection that the positioning of personal temporary shelters and temporary structures are such that egress would be impeded during an emergency.
 - 2. That flammable tarpaulins were being used over personal temporary shelters and other temporary structures.
- (b) The premises are so used or occupied that fire would endanger life or property;
 - 3. Personal temporary shelters and temporary structures are placed too close to combustible brush.
 - Inadequate secondary egress paths from personal temporary shelters and other structures.
- (c) Combustible or explosive material is kept or other flammable conditions exist on the premises so as to endanger life or property.
 - 5. Propane cylinders are being stored improperly and are inadequately secured.
 - 6. Open flame heating and lighting was used within visible area close to combustible structures.

- 7. Household furniture (sofas and chairs) are being used in personal temporary shelters and temporary structures creating an excessive fuel load.
- 8. Pallets, lumber and combustible construction materials are being used and stored creating an excessive fuel load.
- 9. Open flame cooking devices are being used with inadequate clearances to combustible materials.
- 10. Smoking was observed over walkways, sitting areas, within combustible structures, and egress. A small, extinguished fire that appeared to have been caused by a cigarette was observed on June 27th, 2018.

(d) A fire hazard exists on the premises;

- 11. The area is dry and prone to wildfire. On June 26th, 2018, a fire on similar land within a half kilometre consumed an area of approximately the same size of Regina Park in approximately five minutes.
- 12. Tents and structures are adjacent to, within, underneath, and on top of dry vegetation that can easily being ignited.

YOU ARE HEREBY ORDERED TO:-

- 1.) Position all personal temporary shelters and temporary structures so that they are separated by one (1) metre to prevent the rapid spread of fire.
- 2.) Remove flammable tarpaulins over personal temporary shelters and other structures.
- 3.) Personal temporary shelters and temporary structures must be positioned such that entrances face a path of egress and have three (3) metres of clearance away from combustible brush.
- 4.) Remove all tents within three (3) metres of a combustible fence or structure.
- 5.) Ensure a path of egress is maintained clear of obstructions for all personal temporary shelters and temporary structures.
- 6.) Have all propane cylinders stored in a secured area away from egress routes.
- 7.) Remove all open flame lighting and heating from personal temporary shelters.
- 8.) Remove combustible household furniture from the site.
- 9.) Remove all combustible construction materials, wood pallets, lumber, flooring, carpet, underlay and excessive combustible storage from the site.
- 10.) Separate open flame cooking equipment a minimum of three (3) metres from combustible materials and do not use under combustible overhangs.
- 11.) Ensure no smoking within the park.

The work involved in this Order must be completed within twenty-four (24) hours days after receipt of this order.
